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Be it Known that the subscribers, three of whom are citizens of the United States, with their associates, having formed a Congregation in the City of Pittsburgh, for the purpose of worshiping Almighty God according to the faith, doctrines, discipline and usages of the Hebrew Religion, and being desirous of becoming incorporated agreeably to the provisions of an Act of the General Assembly of the

Commonwealth of Pennsylvania, entitled, "An Act to provide for the Incorporation and Regulation of Certain Corporations" approved the 29th day of April, one thousand eight hundred and seventy-four, do hereby declare, set forth and certify that the following are the purposes objects, articles and conditions of the said Association, for which they desire to be incorporated.

First: The name of the Corporation shall be

"Congregation Beth Israel."

Second: The said Corporation is formed for the purpose of the worship of Almighty God, according to the faith, doctrines, discipline and usages of the Hebrew Religion.

Third: The location of the said Corporation and the place wherein its business is to be transacted is the City of Pittsburg.

Fourth: The Corporation is to have perpetual existence,

The Corporation has no capital stock. The membership herein shall be composed of the subscribers and their associates and of such other persons as may from time to time be admitted by vote, in such manner and upon such requirements as may be prescribed by the By-Laws. The said Corporation shall, nevertheless, have power to exclude, expel or suspend members for such just and legal causes and in such legal manner as may be directed by the By-Laws.

Sixth: The oversight and management of the said Corporation shall be vested in a board of five trustees, a majority of whom shall be laymen, and such officers of the Corporation as may under the By-Laws be trustees ex officio. The said trustees shall be elected annually by the adult members of the Congregation from among the adult male members of the same on the 15th day of September in each year at the house of worship of the said Congregation. The said trustees shall hold their offices until the 15th day of September in the succeeding year and until their successors are legally elected; subject, nevertheless, to the power of a motion of any trustee or trustees from the said office for such legal cause and upon such proper and legal notice as may be provided for by the By-Laws. And the said Pinkus Sieblich, shall be the President of the Board of Trustees for the first year, and until the next annual election. The Corporation shall have power to hold, purchase and transfer such real and personal property as its purposes may require; not exceeding the amount limited by law; and all the property thereof shall be taken and held to ensure, subject to the control and disposition of the lay members of the Corporation.

Seventh. This Corporation shall have power to mortgage its real estate for any purpose consistent with the objects of its incorporation; and the President and Secretary shall have power to execute such mortgage or mortgages and the bond or bonds of the Corporation to accompany the same as may be authorized by resolution adopted by a majority of the members in good standing of this Corporation present and voting at any regular meeting, or at any special meeting called for that purpose, after not less than ten days written notice to each of the members of the said Corporation in good standing, which notice whether of a general or special meeting shall state the execution of the said mortgage or mortgages and bond or bonds to accompany the same to be one of the purposes of said meeting, and shall be sent by mail to the last known address of the respective members, or shall be delivered to them personally and respectively.

Eighth. The By-Laws of this Corporation shall be deemed and taken to be its law subordinate to the statute aforesaid, this charter, the constitution and laws of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania and the Constitution of the United States. They shall be altered and amended as provided for by one of the By-Laws themselves and shall prescribe the powers and functions of the trustees herein mentioned and those to be hereafter elected, the times and place of meeting of the trustees and of this Corporation both for business and religious purposes; the number of members who shall constitute a quorum at the meetings of the Corporation and of the trustees; the qualifications and manner of electing members; the manner of selecting officers and the powers and duties of such
