To the Honorable Judges of said Court:

In compliance with the requirements of the Act of Assembly of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania, entitled, an Act to provide for the incorporation and reg-

ulation of certain corporations proved the 29th day of April, 1874 and the supplements thereto and the amendments thereof, the undersigned, all of whom are citizens of the United States, and State of Pennsylvania, have associated themselves for the purpose of applying for a charter of Incorporation with the rights and privileges hereinafter set forth; pray your Honors by a decree of this court, to erect them and their successors, forever, into a corporation according to law and thereby certify:

FIRST: Name. The name of the proposed corporation is AHAVAS ZEDECK ANSHA GLENWOOD, of Pittsburg.

SECOND: Purpose. Said corporation is formed for the purpose of the support of the public worship of Almighty God according to the faith, doctrine, discipline and usage of the Orthodox Jewish Religion and that for that purpose to maintain a synagogue.
