

UJF Record Drive Results in Record For Education & IEF

Approving the distribution of \$4,001,562—proceeds from the largest fund-raising campaign in the history of the Pittsburgh Jewish community—the United Jewish Federation Board allocated record increases to Jewish education and culture and a 56 per cent increase to the Israel Emergency Fund, it was announced by Saul F. Shapira, UJF president.

The action was taken following a report by Milton J. Porter, chairman of the Planning and Budgeting Committee which reviewed the needs and requests of each UJF agency and National and Overseas organizations.

The Israel Emergency Fund received \$1,769,082, a dollar increase of \$635,269 over last year. United Jewish Appeal will receive \$835,930 from regular campaign funds. Budgeting of national and overseas agencies other than UJA will be completed in August and announced at that time.
