

Jewish National Folk Shule Opens September 6th

The Jewish National Folk Shule will open for the new school term on Tuesday, September 6.

The beautiful, airy quarters on the first floor of 2223 Murray Avenue are very conveniently located for the entire Squirrel Hill community, and a center for Jewish education and culture.

The Jewish National Folk Shule aims to provide the American Jewish child with a knowledge of the culture in Yiddish and Hebrew literature, and at the same time to create a closer bond of union with the living tissue of the Jewish people of our own day. For this purpose the Jewish National Folk Shule will teach Yiddish and Hebrew reading, writing and literature, Jewish history from the earliest period to the present time, Jewish nursery rhymes, songs and folklore. It will foster appropriate celebration of Jewish holidays, and discussion of Jewish current events.

The school will be conducted in a progressive, national spirit. This is assured by the Jewish National Workers Alliance, Poale Zion, Pioneer Women's Organization, and other progressive elements sponsoring the undertaking. Its officers consist of the following: chairman, Harry Morgan; financial secretary, Max M. Schwartz; treasurer, Dr. A. J. Ishlon; secretary, S. L. Fuss.

Registration of children is going on daily, 10:00 to 12:00 A. M. and 7:00 to 9:00 P. M. at the school. Further information may be obtained by calling Hazel 2227 or any of the officers.

A campaign for membership in the Jewish National Folk Shule organization at \$5.00 a year is now in full swing under the chairmanship of S. Osheroff, in cooperation with the committee of fifteen.

On Sunday evening, September 11, a dinner in celebration of the opening of the Folk Shule will be held at the school. The public is cordially invited to be present and to cooperate in the promotion of progressive Jewish education in Pittsburgh.
