
JWL Mikvah Re-Opens Its Community Service

T ewly refurbished "with materials and equipment to produce a kosher and pleasing facility," according to Mrs. Howard Balsam and Mrs. Sidney Gross, the Mikvah of the Jewish Women's League for Taharath Hamishpoche is back in full operation.

With many devices and mechanical operations designed for the safety and comfort of users, the Mikvah is the culmination of years of effort on the part of the Jewish Women's League.

The Mikvah, on the corner of Pittock Street and Shady Avenue in Squirrel Hill, was designed by Nick Welner, consulting engineer, in consultation with the building committee.

Mr. Welner is a consultant on engineering structures. A graduate of the University of Birmingham, England, he was advisor to the Israeli government on water pipelines in the Negev. In addition, he did design work for the Niagara Falls Hydroelectric Works, as well as designing buildings in the tristate area and Canada.
