Dear Fellow Members:

By now you should all be aware of the severe fire that damaged the Synagogue on December 12. As of the writing of this letter, the main Synagogue has been repainted and is now being used for services everyday and Shabbos, SO PLEASE ATTEND. The social hall and kitchen will be completely redone and completed with a new ceiling, lights and sanitas by February 1, 1982.

As a total overview, the Synagogue will be reimbursed for the bulk of their loss by insurance proceeds but in turn there are many items in the Synagogue, both the new building and the small old building that were never done in the past. Through approval by the board we are planning to make many changes in both buildings to enhance both the inside and the outside appearances. These are items which should have been done in the past but will be done now. In order to do these things we are going to appeal to members of the Synagogue to make donations to a rebuilding fund for the board to see fit to use for the best suitable purposes.

We are planning a gala Restoration Ball to be chaired by Marty and Goldyne Cohen and Milt and Reva Zelkowitz sometime in May or June. In conjunction with the ball we are planning to have an ad book to supplement our fund raising activities and we will need help in order to make this a success.

All of the items which we are planning to do are for the benefit of each and every member and the Synagogue not only for today but for the future. As we have asked in the past we would like all of you to attend Congregation meetings so that you can keep in touch with all the transitions taking place.

MESSAGE FROM SISTERHOOD PRESIDENT

Dear Sisterhood:

I know that I don't have to tell you about the loss the Synagogue had, but are you aware of the loss the Sisterhood suffered?

I can't describe the feeling I got when we went to take inventory of items in the refrigerators and freezers (besides other items) and I know Goldyne felt the same way I did. We lost all of our baking and cooking supplies, wine, donor merchandise, glasses, as well as bingo items that our Sisterhood was selling.

It was very heartbreaking to dump all of that in garbage cans. Everything was a total loss that was in the part of the building we stored all of these things. When I call on all of you to help, please pitch in both physically as well as financially -- this is a must if we are to reorganize and buy replacements.

It is true that the insurance will pay for many of the things, but they also depreciate so that will put us in the position of having to come up with money for the difference.

Saturday, January 9th was the first time since December 5th that we had services in the main Sanctuary; it was a good feeling, very good to be "back home". We should all thank G-d that no one was injured. Some of our Torahs were badly smoked and heat of the fire may have dried the parchment - we still don't know to what extent they were damaged. Our Rabbi took some of them to New York to be checked.

We had to cancel some of our activities, the Reward Party being one. Our Donor Luncheon will be postponed till Sunday, April 18, 1982.

This month we are trying something new. The meetings seem to be losing steam, so we are going to try afternoon meetings, then we will see what the results will be. Bertha Zane arranged for a terrific speaker, Frumma Rosenberg. I have heard her speak and I am positive that you also will enjoy her,

By the time the meeting day arrives, I will be in the position to tell you what we will be doing to the social hall. Don't forget, Monday AFTER NOON, 12:30 January 25th.

Ralph and I would like to thank you for the good wishes on his recent surgery.
