

NOW... Torah study is part of Pittsburgh's Renaissance

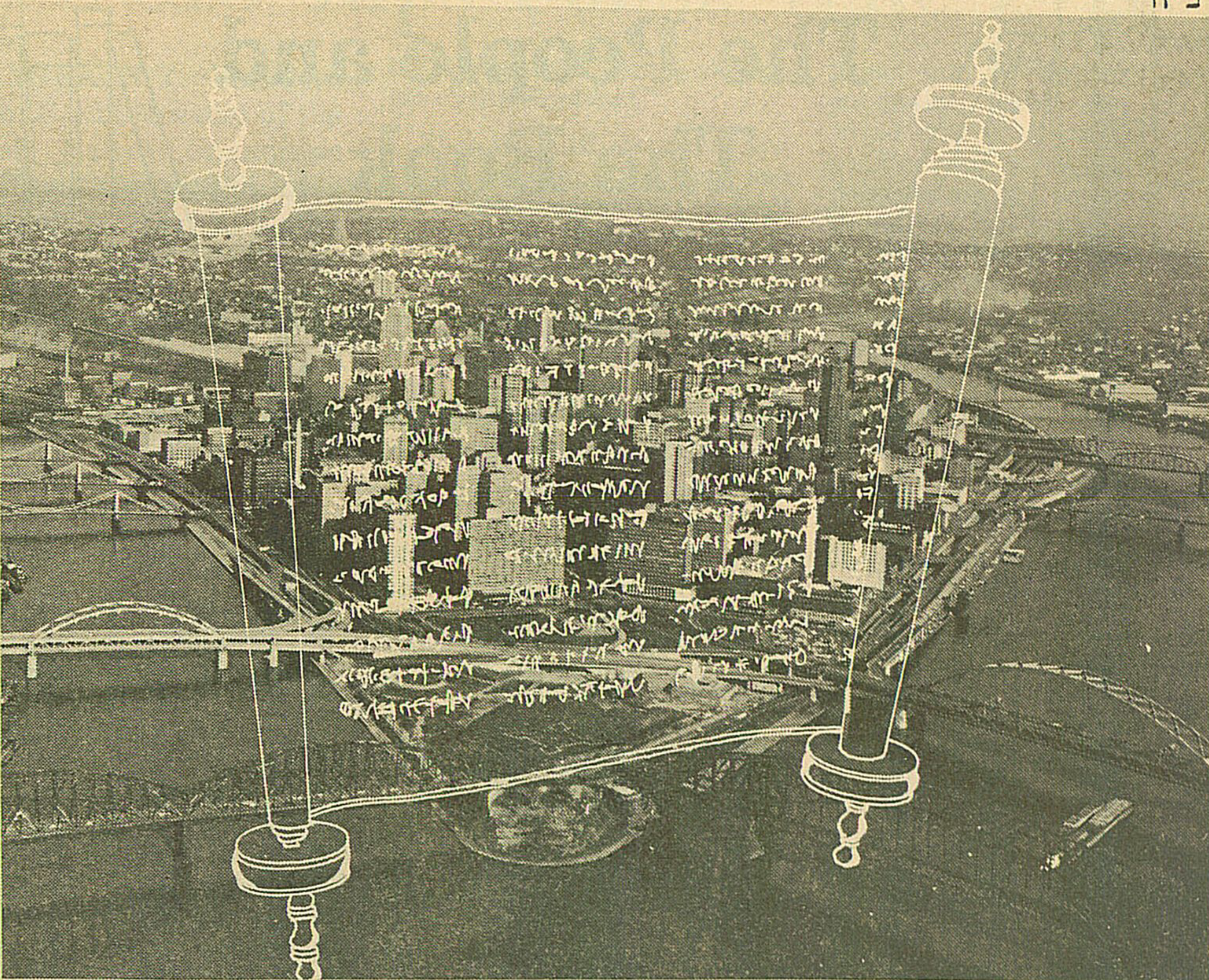

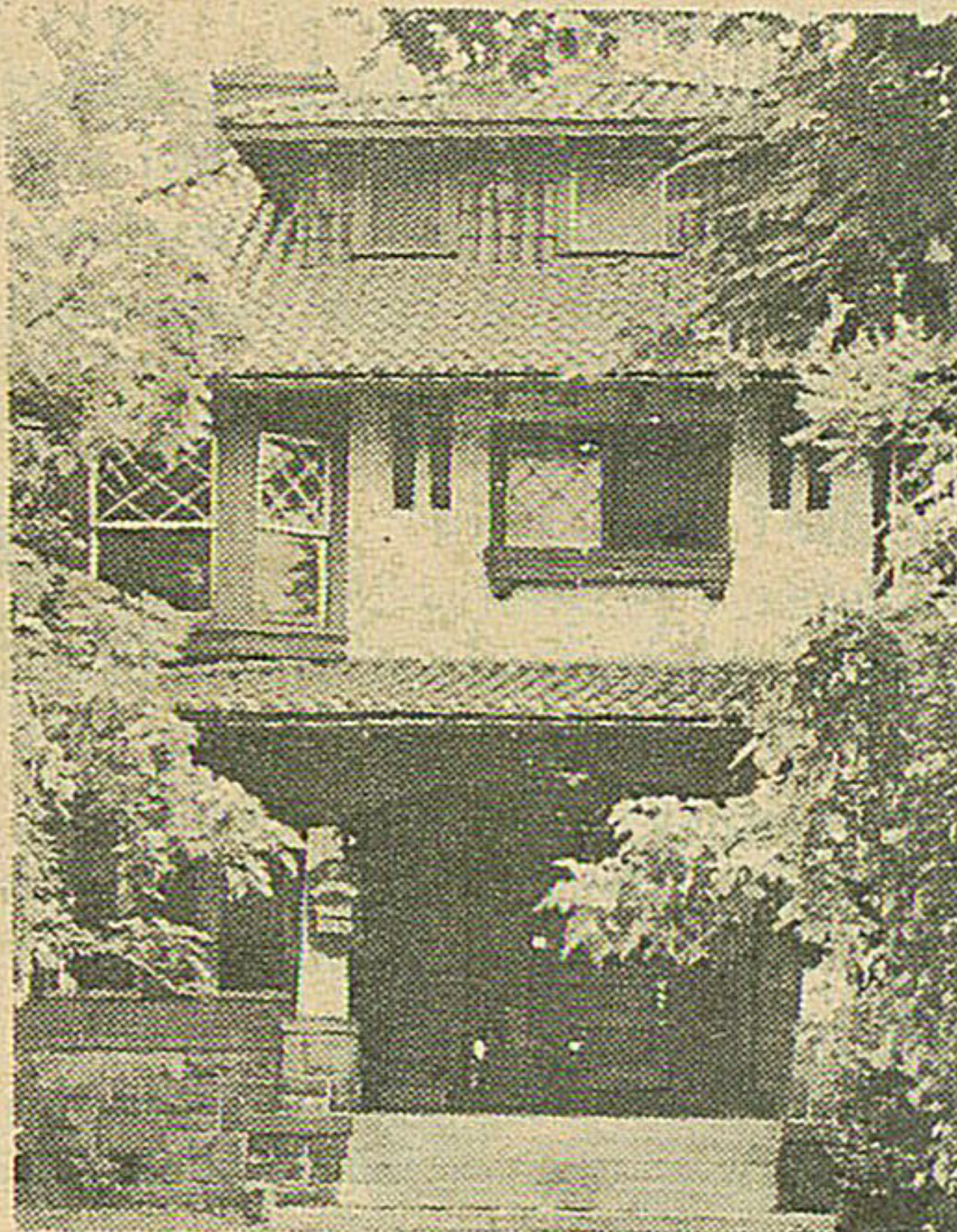

Congregation Shaare Zedeck has granted the use of its building on Bartlett Street as headquarters of the Yeshiva G'dola.



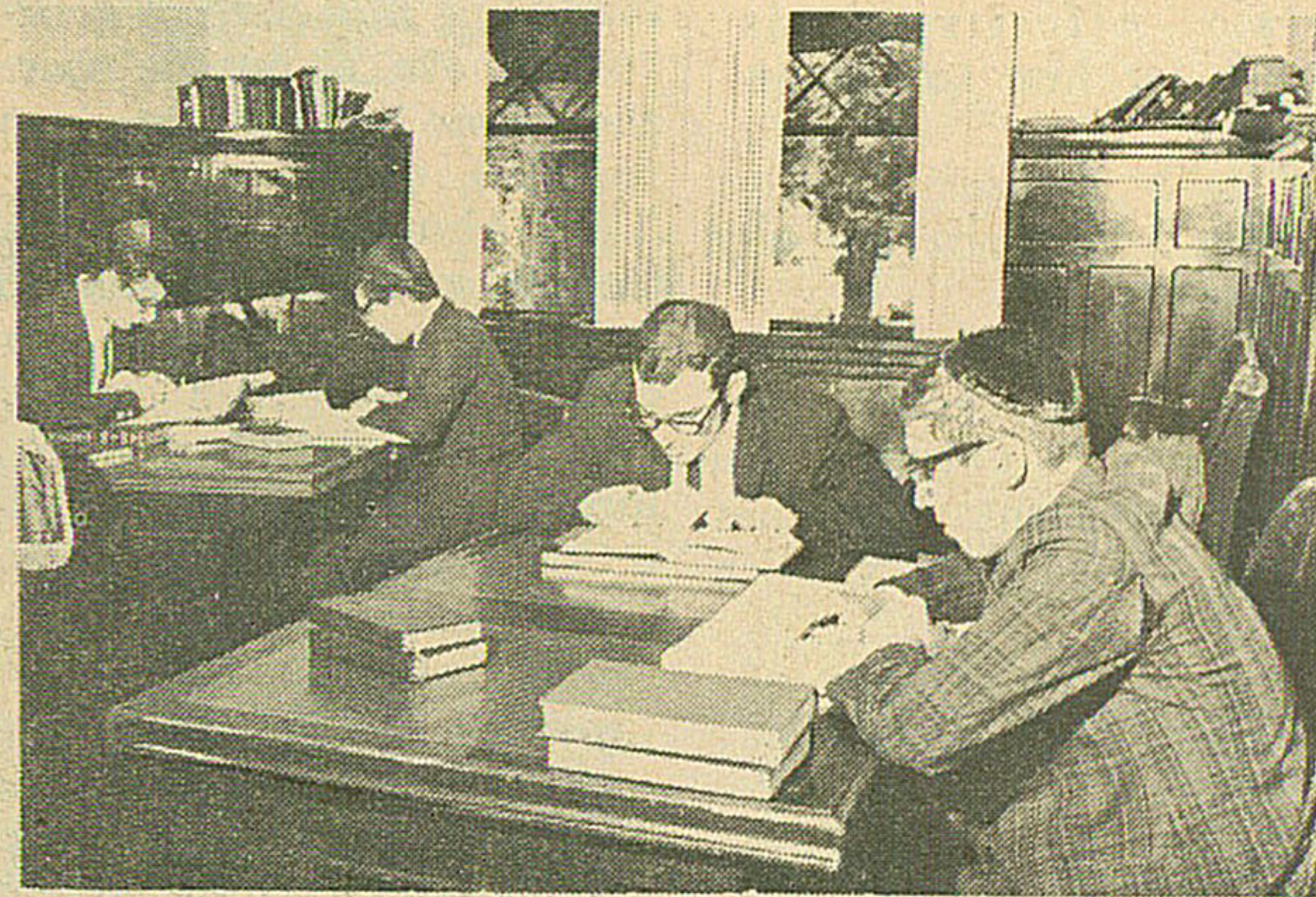
