The subscribers, all of whom are citizens of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania, having associated themselves together for the purposes hereinafter set forth, and being desirous to be created a corporation under the provisions of the act of General Assembly of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania, entitled an act to provide for the incorporation and regulation of certain corporations, approved the 29th day of April 1874, and the several supplements thereto, do hereby declare, set forth and certify:

First: The name of this corporation shall be the "Hebrew Ladies' Hospital Aid Society."

Second: It shall be the purpose of this Society to assist and provide the deserving sick, injured and disabled with proper medical and surgical attention, and hospital treatment, and, when its funds will permit, to establish, support and manage a hospital for affording medical and surgical aid to the sick, injured and disabled.

Third: The business of said Corporation shall be conducted in the City of Pittsburgh, state aforesaid.

Fourth: This Corporation shall exist perpetually.
