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should not be granted, the Court now grants the application and it is ordered and decreed that upon the foregoing amended Charter being recorded the said Society shall be a corporation under the terms therein specified.

The petition of the undersigned, respectfully
represents:

That they are citizens of the Commonwealth
of Pennsylvania, and do hereby agree to associate
ourselves with others for religious purposes as
a Congregation, under the name and style of
"Ahavas Achem" (Brotherly Love) Congregation
(for worshipping Almighty God according to the
faith doctrine, discipline and usage of the Hebrew
religion) of the Borough of McKeesport, County of
Allegheny and State of Pennsylvania, according
to the requirements of an Act of the General As-
sembly of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania, en-
titled "An Act to provide for the incorporation
and regulation of certain corporations, approved
the 29th day of April A.D. 1874 and its supplements"
and being desirous that we may be incorporated
under said Act and its supplements, we do here-
by certify the charter or articles of incorporation
as follows to wit:

First: The name of the Corporation shall be
the "Ahavas Achem" (Brotherly Love) Congregation

Second. The object of said Corporation are the maintaining of a synagogue for the purpose of worshipping Almighty God, according to the faith, doctrines, discipline and usages of the orthodox Jewish faith, and the establishing of a good school for instructing the young in the principles of religion as well as in the general branches of knowledge.

Third. The place of business of said Corporation shall be in the Borough of M^r Keesport, County of Allegheny, Pennsylvania.

Fourth. The corporation is to have perpetual existence or until legally dissolved.

Fifth. This corporation is not formed for profit and has therefore no capital stock.

Sixth. The corporation shall have power to adopt By-Laws not inconsistent with the Constitution and laws of the United States, or the Constitution and laws of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania, and not contrary with this Charter.

Seventh. The business affairs or management of said corporation shall be conducted by a President, Vice-President, Secretary, Treasurer and Board of three (3) Trustees, and such other officers as the By-Laws may prescribe. The names and residences of the officers who were chosen for the ensuing year are:

Eighth. The election of officers, their terms of office their qualifications for office and membership, rules for the admission of members and the power to exclude, expel and suspend members the payment of dues, assessment and pew-rents the time and place of holding meetings of the corporation, the work of altering, amending re-

vising, suspending or adding to the By-Laws, and all matters pertaining to the proper government of the corporation for the purpose for which it is organized; all these matters shall be provided for and regulated by the By-Laws.

Ninth. The Corporation shall have power to hold, purchase and transfer such real and personal property as its purposes may require, not exceeding the amount limited by law, and all the property thereof shall be taken and held to ensure, subject to the control and disposition of the lay members of this corporation.

Tenth. This corporation shall have all the rights, privileges and immunities given to such corporations by the several Acts of Assembly now in force or hereafter to be passed, in such cases made and provided and shall be subject to all restrictions thereby imposed.
