Petition

To the Honorable the Judges of the said Court:

In compliance with the requirements of the Act of the General Assembly of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania, entitled "An act to provide for the incorporation and regulation of certain corporations approved the 27th day of April 1874 and the several supplements thereto," especially the acts of the 6th day of April 1893, the undersigned all of whom are citizens and residents of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania, having associated themselves together as a secret fraternal beneficial society for the purposes herein specified and desiring that they may be incorporated according to law do hereby certify as follows.

1st. The name of the intended corporation is the

"Independent Order of David Rosenberg of Western Pennsylvania."

2nd. The purpose for which the corporation is formed is to unite fraternally persons of proper age and good social and moral character in a fraternal beneficial society with a ritualistic
