I, MORRIS KINGSBACHER, of the City of Pittsburgh, County of Allegheny, and State of Pennsylvania, being of sound mind, memory and understanding, do hereby make, publish and declare this to be my last will and testament, hereby revoking any and all wills by me heretofore at any time made.

FIRST: I give and bequeath to the J. M. Gusky Hebrew Orphanage and Home of Western Pennsylvania the sum of One Hundred (\$100.00) dollars.

SECOND: I give and bequeath to the B'Nai B'Rith Orphanage and Home for Friendless Children at Erie, Pennsylvania, the sum of One Hundred (\$100.00) Dollars.

THIRD: I give and bequeath to the Jewish Home for the Aged at Pittsburgh, Pennsylvania, the sum of One Hundred (\$100.00) Dollars.

FOURTH: I give, devise and bequeath unto my beloved wife, Sophia Kingsbacher, all the rest, residue and remainder of my estate to have and to hold for and during the term of her natural life; and after her death all said rest, residue and remainder of my estate shall be equally divided among my four (4) children: Erma Stix, Gertrude Sunstein, Alvin Kingsbacher and Florence Frank. It is my will, however, that my beloved wife shall have the right during her lifetime, at her discretion, to consume any or all of the principal of my estate, if she so wishes. She shall not be answerable to remaindermen for the preservation of my estate nor shall she be required to give bond or any security for the benefit of said remaindermen.

FIFTH: It is my wish that if it is possible for the executors of this will to amicably agree with the partner or partners surviving me in the firm of Kingsbacher Brothers of Pittsburgh, Pennsylvania, that my interest in said co-partnership should be kept alive and that my capital in said co-partnership should remain invested therein. To bring this about, I advise that the business be incorporated, to allow my capital to remain invested therein to enable

its valuable employees to obtain an interest therein; the amount of interest of said employees to be determined by my executors and said surviving co-partner or co-partners.

I nominate, constitute and appoint my beloved wife, Sophia Kingsbacher, and my sons-in-law, Elias Sunstein and William K. Frank, executors of this my last will and testament.

I take this opportunity to thank you, my dear wife, from the bottom of my heart, for your love and devotion during our many years of married life. Do not worry. Take life easy. By all means give up housekeeping and take rooms in a hotel or apartment house. I also wish to thank you, my dear children, for your love and affection shown me continuously, assuring you that it contributed much to the happiness of my life.
