We need your passage on the good ship "UJCC" Believe me, we are still a Jewish organization with a Jewish agenda. First, let me tell you about our agenda.

The regular meetings, functions, and activities for Center members and guests head the list. The Center has a library of Jewish books in the carriage house. Our main objective is to be a focal point of activity for our Jewish community. We are in business to serve our members.

B'nai B'rith uses the Center for its monthly meetings as well as other outstanding programs. On Yom Hashoah the yearly Holocaust Memorial service is conducted at the impressive "Holocaust Chai" on the Center grounds. This landscaped and well maintained area attracts many visitors who are passersby on our Route 40.

At the B'nai B'rith Sports Award Dinner, held every spring in the auditorium, the Lodge honors outstanding student athletes with plaques and scholarships.

Our Jewish agenda could be enhanced if we could add 30 or 40 prospective members to the 35 presently on the roster. The cost is nominal: just \$250 yearly for a family and \$125 for an individual - and this can be spread over four payments. Members have full use of our facilities, including the sparkling supervised swimming pool and the surrounding picnic grounds.

The U.J.C.C. houses Uniontown's Temple Israel where religious services are conducted in a solemn setting. The auditorium, with a newly installed Ark and Bimah, was used this year for the High Holiday services. Under the direction of Rabbi David, a religious school with an initial enrollment of eight children, has also been introduced.

A word about our community service program. The Center conducts one of the top daycare centers in Western Pennsylvania, the only one providing a supervised swimming program for the youngsters. Day care centers are here to stay, and this operation helps to keep our Center financially stable, while serving a vital community need.. Other organizations, such as Mental Health, Lifeline Screening, the American Bridge League, etc., also rent our facilities, allowing us to provide more community service, without compromising our own programs.

So, when you are invited to join or rejoin the U.J.C.C. , remember that we are an organization of Jews working for the benefit of the Jews of our area.

Please join us and help the Center to grow and prosper.
