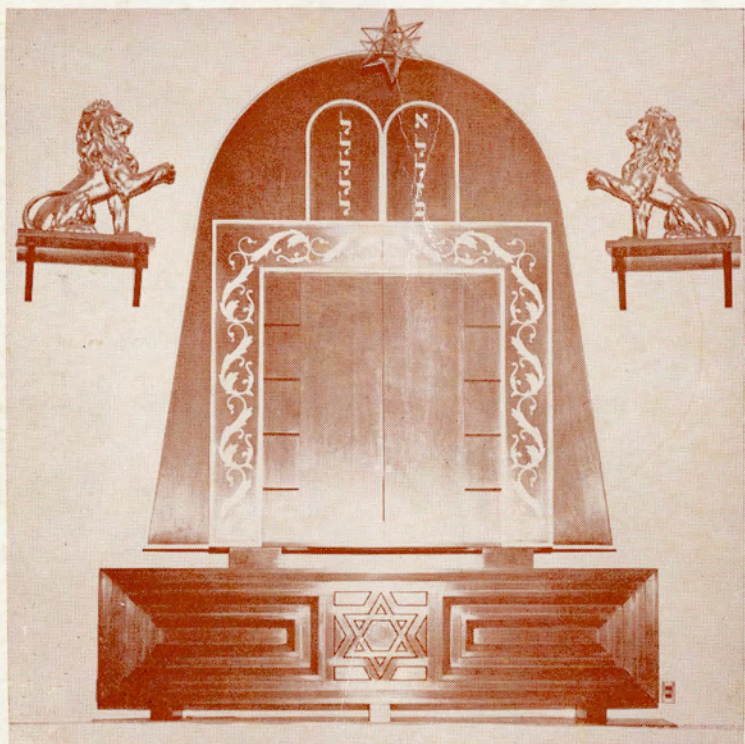

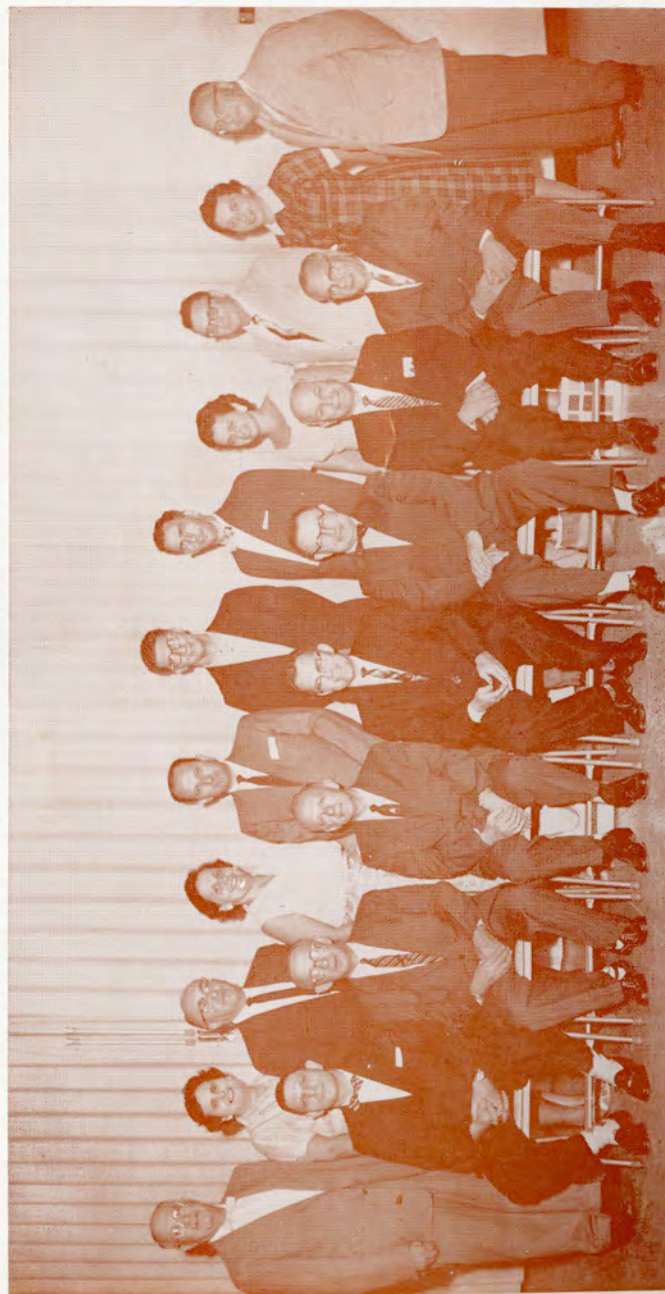

A BRIEF HISTORY OF THE CENTER

MARCH 28, 1957—Charter granted in Beaver County Court.

APRIL 10, 1957—First organization meeting held at the A. A. Synagogue. The following officers and members of board elected: President, Dr. Milton Eger; Vice President (Building), Barnett Feldman; Vice President (Finance), Morris Selkovits; Secretary, Dr. Douglas A. Lehman; Treasurer, Ellis E. Karp. Members of the Board: Morris Chaimovitz, Sam Jacobs, Dr. Harry Marcus, Harvey Cohen, Mrs. Henry Berger, Mrs. Milton Selkovits, Albert E. Oliker, Norman D. Thomashefsky, Sidney H. Eger, Bernard Wilkoff, Mrs. Jerome Moidel, Mrs. Sol Neft.

A BRIEF HISTORY OF THE CENTER (Con't)

MAY 14, 1957—Nathan Cantor, Associates, retained as architects for the proposed new Jewish Community Center Building.

MAY 22, 1957—Charter Night held at Oddfellows Hall at which time approximately 200 signatures were placed on the charter.

SUMMER, 1957—Investigated possibility of establishing a jointure with Ambridge, Sewickley and Coraopolis. This plan did not materialize.

JANUARY 12, 1958—First fund-raising drive held at J&L Veterans' Building. Judge Samuel A. Weiss—guest speaker. Fifty-three contributors pledged \$67,025.00 over a 5-year period.

JULY 23, 1958—Bids were opened for the Community Center Building.

AUGUST 4, 1958—Construction loan and mortgage application was approved by the Mellon National Bank.

SEPTEMBER 21, 1958—Officers were authorized by a membership meeting to borrow the necessary sums of money for construction of the building. Charter of the Aliquippa Community Center was officially adopted by the membership.

SEPTEMBER 26, 1958—Kubia Enterprises of Ambridge was awarded the construction contract.

OCTOBER 12, 1958—Groundbreaking ceremony was held with the membership in attendance and Burgess James Bruno, Banker John Neish, Architect Nathan Cantor and Builder John Kubia as guest speakers.

OCTOBER 16, 1958—Actual construction began.

NOVEMBER 25, 1958—Annual membership meeting. All officers were re-elected with the following trustees elected to the board:

APRIL 4, 1959—First Bar-Mitzvah held in the new center.

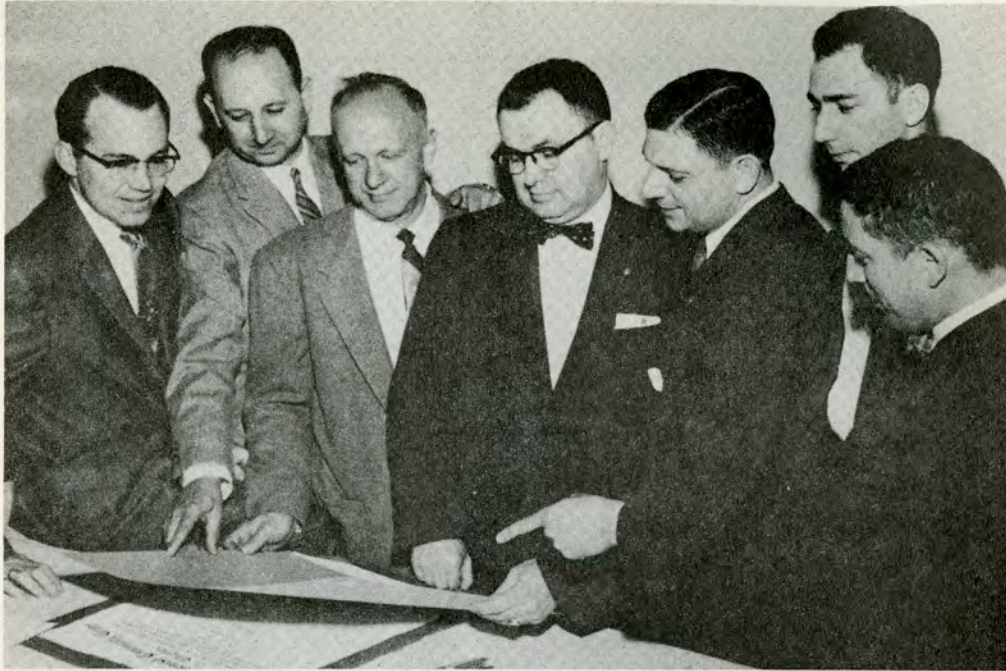
APRIL 18, 1959—First youth group dance (Apple Blossom festival).

AGUDATH ACHIM CONGREGATION

DEVELOPMENT AND HISTORY OF THE CONGREGATION

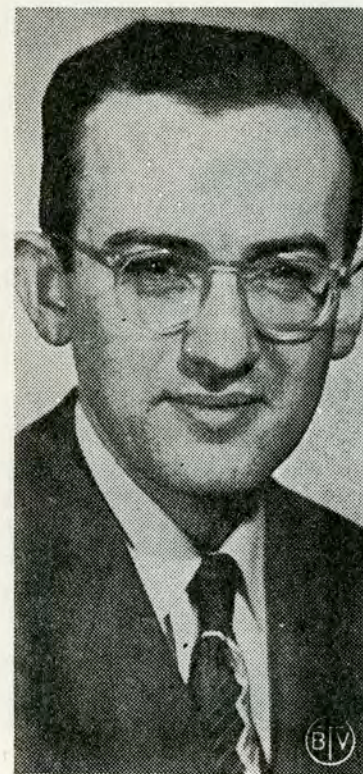

The beginnings of the Agudath Achim Congregation of Aliquippa are shrouded in uncertain memory. Its start was humble and unsung; like Topsy, it just grew. It was founded approximately in 1909 by men to whom the need for religious assembly was as much a part of life as the necessity to work. There are no official records in which are inscribed the names of the earliest Jewish inhabitants of Aliquippa, who banded together to form an "Agudath Achim," a "Union of Brothers." Here are the names of a few, active in the congregation, from its inception until its incorporation. M. Selkovitz, I. Thomashefsky, J. Recht, N. Nieman, M. Weinberger, A. Itzkovitz, S. Roth, H. Roth, M. Neiman, J. Rush, D. L. Klein, S. Rottenstein, B. Herskovitz, B. Neiman, M. Fineman.

Among the first spiritual leaders of the Congregation were the late Rabbi Lazarovitz. In those days, the teens of the twentieth century, the Jewish inhabitants of Woodlawn had no permanent house of worship. Services were successively held in the Logstown Church, in the Romanian Hall on Kiehl Street and at the German Beneficial Society on Sheffield Avenue. In 1918, a residence was purchased on Elm Alley for the Rabbi's home. The congregation then began to think of permanent quarters and the need to incorporate in order to purchase real estate with such a view in mind. On September 8, 1919, five men of the shul signed papers by which a state charter was granted to the Agudath Achim Synagogue and registered at the county courthouse in Beaver. These men were: the late Samuel Rottenstein of Evans City; Meyer Fineman, now a resident of Pittsburgh and President of the Men's Club at the Beth Shalom Synagogue; Nathan Neiman and Adolph Itzkovitz, members of the Congregation to this day; and Samuel Donner.

Shortly thereafter, the Elm Alley house was sold and a double lot on Franklin Avenue was purchased upon which the Tudor Apartments are now located. In 1921, this property was sold and the present location of the shul at 501 Church Street was acquired. At that time it was a one story, wooden frame building, belonging to the Methodist Church. In the nineteen twenties much money was spent to improve the structure. A concrete foundation and basement were added; the inside of the Synagogue proper was plastered; then the entire exterior was bricked over to improve appearances. Among the spiritual leaders between 1920 and 1930 were Rabbis Deaktor, Eiseman, Singer and Samet.

In the early nineteen thirties the depressed economic situation of the country was reflected in the difficulties of the congregation. It was necessary to pay off the mortgage. The people of the community responded nobly in the hour of crisis and the burden of debt was removed.

In the thirties there were several men who advanced the spiritual life of the Jewish community. Among them were Rabbi Handler, Mr. Bernard Kaplan (a Hebrew teacher and Sunday School supervisor), Rabbi Hershon, Rabbi Simches and Rabbi Appleman.

In the nineteen forties, Rabbis Miller, Weinstein and Sanders were the teachers and preachers engaged by the Shul. In the Fall of 1948, Rabbi Pritzker a recent graduate of Yeshiva University was hired and has remained until now.

The congregation was dissolved as of June 30, 1959, and the building is to be sold, and assets transferred to the Center.

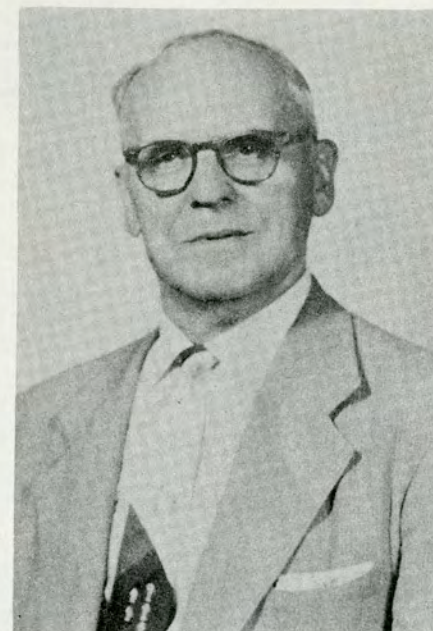

ALIQUIPPA CHAPTER OF HADASSAH

When Henrietta Szold, American scholar, teacher, social worker and staunch Zionist founded Hadassah in 1912, she did not envisage "just another organization!" She sought a "way of life" . . . "a design for living". . . for those who enrolled to work with her. This has been and still is Hadassah's goal.

The 318,000 members who make up Hadassah's 1300 chapters throughout the world maintain a twofold program - in America and in Israel.

Here in America, through its American affairs program, Hadassah keeps members informed so they may be enabled to understand and protect our democratic heritage and institutions and strengthen the role of democracy as a force for freedom and peace abroad.

Through its Zionist affairs work, Hadassah interprets Israel and its people to the American public, thus forging closer links between two sister democracies.

Hadassah seeks to build a strong Zionist Youth movement in America through Junior Hadassah, Young Judea and the Student Zionists.

In Israel, Hadassah's magnificent advances in Medicine have brought life and hope to those broken in body and spirit. From what was formerly a country ravaged with trachoma and leprosy, Israel has been transformed to the medical oasis of the Middle East.

Hadassah supports seven hospitals, a network of community health services, and the outstanding Henrietta Szold School of Nursing. Also, it is with great expectation that Hadassah looks forward to the completion of the new Hadassah-Hebrew University Medical Center outside Jerusalem to be known as "Kiryat Hadassah," (Hadassah Town). Post graduate fellowships to the U. S. and extensive research have been made possible through Hadassah funds.

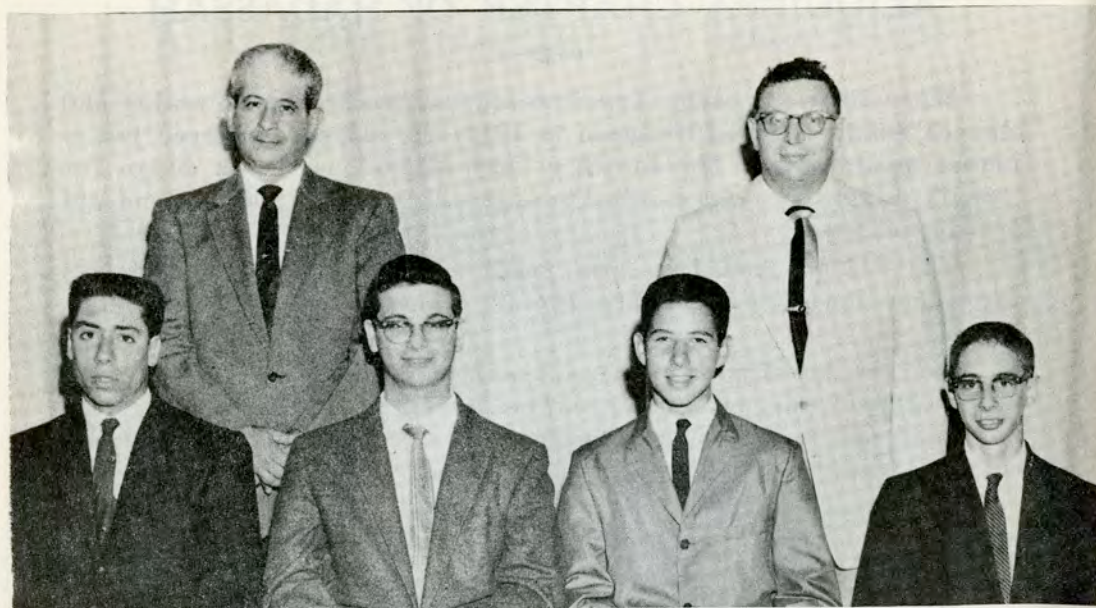
Over 90,000 Jewish orphans from 72 countries have been rescued and helped to a new life through Hadassah's Youth Aliyah movement. Many more wait to be admitted.

A comprehensive vocational education system designed scientifically to train young men and women to take their places in Israel's expanding economy is also included in Hadassah's work. Listed among the various schools are those for dress designing and hotel management.

Through the Jewish National Fund, Hadassah has participated in the reclamation of tens of thousands of acres for farm and industrial sites, and has planted several million trees in Israel including 500,000 in the "Forest of the Six Million" in memory of the Jews martyred during the Nazi holocaust.

The members of the Aliquippa Chapter of Hadassah are proud to be part of this outstanding organization whose motto is not live and let live, but "Live and Help Live."

Aleph Zadik Aleph (AZA) is the largest Jewish youth group in the world. The letters represent the motto of the B'nai B'rith, our sponsoring order. Thus, the first Aleph stands for AHOVOH (BROTHERLY LOVE), the Zadik means T'SDAHAK (BENEVOLENCE), and the second Aleph symbolizes ACHDOOS (HARMONY).

The Five-Fold-and-Full program of AZA was presented in 1928 by the late Dr. Boris D. Bogen, who spoke in terms of an all-around AZA program based on religious, community service, athletic, cultural, and social activities. It is the duty of every chapter within AZA to guide its activities along the lines of the Bogen program.

The seven cardinal principles of AZA are:

PATRIOTISM—loyalty to my homeland, to its laws, principles, and ethics. To die for it if need be, but primarily to live for it.

JUDAISM—always to observe the tenets of my faith; ever to do justice, love mercy, and walk humbly with the lord my G—d.

FILIAL LOVE—ever to honor and love my parents. To be considerate of my elders and to respect age.

CHARITY—to give of myself and my substance for all worthy causes; to be kind and generous to all in need, regardless of race or creed.

CONDUCT—never too bold, never too forward, ever humble, ever observing the principles of gentlemen.

PURITY—to keep my soul pure, my mind active, and my body healthy.

FRATERNITY—a spirit of sociability, of cooperation, and a friendship toward all AZA's that shall make us one great fellowship: a love of and a loyalty to AZA and its ideals.

BBG is one of the largest organizations in the world. Any Jewish girl of high school age is eligible for membership. With the help of advisors, BBG has maintained a democratic membership policy, which does not sanction voting on members and which has made the benefits of the organization on a first-come first-served basis.

The objectives of the BBG are as follows:

1. To help its members feel at home in the Jewish community
2. To afford its members group life experiences which give them an understanding of and loyalty to our democratic heritage
3. To offer leisure-time activities in which youth make friends, express interests, and develop skills
4. To learn by doing whereby youth become ethical in human relationships, and devoted to home and community responsibilities.

These purposes are fulfilled by planning activities around the **SIX-FOLD PROGRAM**. The six folds are:

A. **JEWISH HERITAGE**- Includes religious activities as well as Jewish singing, folk dancing, and Israeli movies.

B. **CITIZENSHIP**- Having interfaith programs and vocational guidance.

C. **SERVICE**- Fund raising and community service.

D. **CREATIVITY**- All original work done by members.

E. **FELLOWSHIP**- New members and penpals.

F. **RECREATION**- Social and athletics.

THE SYNAGOGUE CHAPEL



Our front cover shows the Holy Ark which is on the platform at the front of the chapel. This ark contains parchment scrolls on which the Five Books of Moses (Genesis, Exodus, Leviticus, Numbers, and Deuteronomy) have been written by hand. This ancient method of reproducing the Books of the Scriptures reminds the Jews that we are the "People of the Book" linked by an unbroken tradition to those Hebrews who first committed the "Word of God" to writing.

These scrolls are called the Torah "a tree of life to them that hold fast to it," from which a specific portion is read each week at the Sabbath service and are so divided that in the course of one year the whole of the Torah will be read. A special holiday marks the occasion on which the scroll is completed, rerolled, and the reading begun again from Genesis. This holiday is called "Simchas Torah" (Rejoicing over the Torah), signifying man's joy in the continual rediscovery of God's message.

Depicted around the doors of the ark are the leaves of pomegranate. This is primarily a symbol of God's bounty and of man's gratitude. It represents the festival bouquet which is carried in procession on the Festival of Tabernacles, the ancient Hebrew festival of Thanksgiving.

Above the Ark are two tablets with Hebrew letters representing an abbreviation of the ten commandments . . . the original law carved into stone tablets and given to Moses on Mount Sinai.

In front of the Ark, suspended from the ceiling, is the Eternal Light. Linked by Tradition with the light that was kept burning perpetually in the Temple of old, the Eternal Light symbolizes the purity and the permanency of our Faith. It calls to mind such Scripture verses as: "The LORD is my light and my salvation"; "The spirit of man is the light of the LORD"; "For the commandment is a lamp, and the Law is light"; and "I, the LORD, have set thee for a covenant of the people, and for a light unto the nations."

Guarding the ten commandments are two "Lions of Judah" symbolizing the ancient tribe of Judah from which rose King David and King Solomon and from whose historic kingdom the Jews of today are descended. These lions which were transferred from the A.A. synagogue, which was founded 50 years ago, serve as a link with past generations from whom this heritage has been handed down.

The base of the Ark depicts the Mogen David or Shield of David, biblical king of the Jews, who composed many psalms and who slew the giant Goliath, with only his slingshot and this shield as protection.

The twelve lights in the chandelier suspended from the ceiling in the center of the chapel symbolize the "Twelve Tribes of Israel."

By reminding themselves of the Twelve Tribes, Jews, assembled for worship in the synagogue thus become conscious of the fact that they are descendants of the ancient Israelites with whom God made His covenant.



The seven chapel windows remind us of the candles which lit the ancient Temple in Jerusalem as ordained in the Bible: "And thou shalt make a candlestick of pure beaten gold and thou shalt make seven lamps thereof, and they shall light the lamps thereof to give light" Exodus 25:31-40. The number of chapel windows has further significance which reminds us of the days of the week and the word of God commanding to rest on the seventh day. This theme of seven is further carried out in the arrangement of chapel seating with seven pews on each side.

In this synagogue it is customary for all males to wear a prayer shawl with fringes called a "Tallis", and a head covering called a "Yarmulka", to show respect and reverence in the "House of the Lord."

A synagogue is more than a storehouse of memories; it is a living house of prayer, to which Jews come to commune with God. Just as all Christian churches do not follow the same ritual, so there are different patterns of worship in synagogues. The Bible does not prescribe a specific worship service, nor does the Jewish faith empower any single authority to establish rules of worship. Each congregation, therefore, can fashion its own service. Even though the practices in modern synagogues are somewhat varied, there are certain basic prayers around which the service is constructed, serving as a unifying bond among Jewish communities everywhere.

The arrangement of these basic prayers is almost as old as the synagogue itself. The men of the Great Assembly—the prophets, sages, scribes and teachers who led the people in the centuries after their return from Babylonia—established the lines on which Jewish congregational and individual prayer have moved ever since. These men made the B'racha (blessing or benediction) the unit of Jewish prayer, each blessing beginning with the Hebrew words for "Blessed art Thou, O Lord our God, King of the Universe."

Here in America, we do not let our different beliefs keep us from living in peace and harmony with our neighbor. Here in Aliquippa, we are witnessing a tremendous spiritual renaissance as evidenced by the number of new churches that have been built in the past few years. All our religions insist that we respect the dignity of man, and treat our neighbor as a brother. We are all created by one God. This religious concept of the brotherhood of man under the Fatherhood of God is basic to our American democracy. It is the idea that has enabled Americans of many races, religions and ethnic origins to work together and to build a just society. Each individual, in his own way, has contributed to America, and it is the contributions of all that have made America strong. "God hears prayers in many tongues, and they are all sweet in His ears."

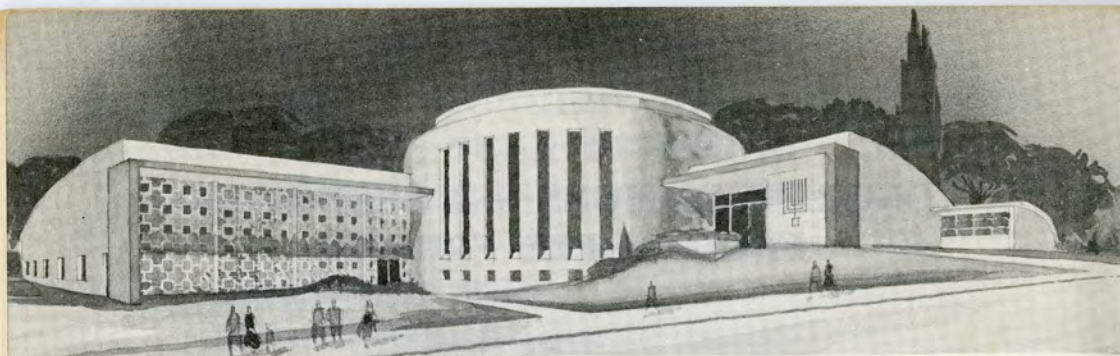
