 Your Committee appointed to present a plan and devise ways and means for the purchase of a new Burial ground or cemetery for the association respectfully submit the following Report
 That the responses to the circular issued by this Committee requesting the members to signify their intention of becoming purchasers under the plan proposed as per annexed circular a copy of which was sent to every member of the association. Does not justify the association in buying a new Burial ground as it would take at least calculation the consent of one hundred members to become purchasers of family Lots according to our plan to assure the success of the same.
 If the association would consent to become involved for the purchase of a new burial ground necessitating the taxation of all the members equally, a course we would not recommend, as we have members who are not desirous of becoming purchasers of family Lots from various motives and as the assent of the required number has not been received in answer to our circular, only receiving answers from about twenty agreeing to become purchasers and from whom the Committee could ascertain not more than

Seventy Members would if called upon consent to become purchasers of family lots, we therefore respectfully suggest that the association takes no further action, looking towards the purchase of a new burial ground at the present time, and request of our Committee to be discharged

The amendment of John Adler striking out the words "fading to match with the sick" three dollars fine out of section 1st Art 8. of the Bylaws was after discussion adopted. On motion it was resolved that the president be and is hereby empowered to send matches to the sick.

Officers

The officers of this association shall be a President Vice president Secretary, Treasurer and three Trustees, who shall constitute the Board of Managers.

Article IV

Duties of officers

§1. It shall be the duty of the President to preside at all Meetings, to keep order and decorum and to see that all Laws and regulations of this association are obeyed. in case of the death of a member, or any member of his family, he shall at the request of the family of the deceased have charge of the corps until interment, to notify the secretary for him to invite the members of the association to the funeral and to detail ten members to escort the corps to the grave. he shall issue permits of Burial. he shall sign all orders, ordered to be issued by the association.

§2. it shall be the duty of the Vice president to perform all the requirements of the president in his absence.

§3. it shall be the duty of the secretary to keep accurately the records of the proceedings of this association, to keep correctly the accounts of the members; he shall receive all moneys due the association, pay the same to the Treasurer, and take his Receipt therefore. he shall countersign all orders and permits of Burial signed by the President. he shall issue all Notices ordered by the President in case of death. he shall keep a correct record of all the deceased Buried in the cemetery. he shall notify the members of regular and special meetings. he shall at the annual meeting in June present a statement of the status of the association, also a List of members liable to suspension for nonpayment of dues and finally at the expiration of his term of office he shall deliver to his successor all Books and papers in his possession that belonging to the association.

§4 it shall be the duty of the Treasurer to receive and safely keep all moneys belonging to the association from the secretary, give Receipt therefore and keep a correct and accurate account of the same. he shall at any time when called on, give a correct statement of the financial standing of the association. he shall also safely keep all valuable and other papers belonging to the association. he shall pay all orders properly signed by the President and countersigned by the secretary. he shall

at his installation into office give a Bond of two thousand dollars \$2000, which must be approved by the Board of Managers for the faithful performance of his office duties and at the expiration of his term of office, shall deliver to his successor all Moneys, valuables and papers in his possession belonging to the association.

§5 The duties of the Board of Managers shall be to take good care of all the property belonging to the association, to see that the cemetery and Buildings thereon are kept in good repair, and make such improvements as are necessary and the members of the association may require them to do from time to time. But in no case to expend more than \$100 for improvements or repair at a time, without obtaining first the consent of the association. it shall be the duty of the Board to assess such charges for the burying of any Israelite (who is not a member of the association) in the cemetery, as they may see proper and circumstances may require. They shall invest all moneys in the Treasurer, over the amount of two hundred dollars in approved Securities. Five members of the Board shall constitute a quorum for general Business and Three members a quorum for the purpose of granting permits or privileges for the interment of nonmembers. They shall have power to elect new members

at their meetings, provided that the application for membership has been on file with the Secretary for at least one month before such meeting.

Article V

membership
