D. 1874, and the several supplements thereto, the undersigned, all of whom are citizens of Pennsylvania, having associated themselves together for the purpose hereinafter specified, and desiring that they may be incorporated, and that a charter may be issued to them and their associates and successors according to law, do hereby certify:

In compliance with the requirements of the Nonprofit Corporation Law of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania, approved the fifth day of May, A. D. 1933, P. L. 289, We the undersigned, all of whom are residents of Pennsylvania, and citizens of the United States, its territories or possessions, and all of whom are of full age, having associated themselves together for the purpose or purposes hereinafter specified, and desiring that they may be incorporated, and that a charter may be issued to them and their associates and successors according to law, do hereby certify:

First. The name of the proposed corporation is FIFTEENTH WARD CHAMBER OF COMMERCE, which name has been duly registered with the Department of State of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania.

Second. The location and post office address of the initial registered office of the proposed corporation in the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania will be 115 Flowers Avenue, Pittsburgh 7, Pennsylvania, County of Allegheny, Pennsylvania.

Third. The corporation does not contemplate pecuniary gain or profit, incidental or otherwise, to its members. The purposes for which it is formed are:

To develop, encourage, promote, and protect the commercial, professional, financial, and general business interests in the community of the 15th Ward, to promote the civic interests and general welfare of the community; to extend and promote the trade and commerce and foster, develop, and protect the industry in the community; to encourage the development of the transportation and communication facilities and various resources of the community; and to procure laws and regulations desirable for the benefit of business in general, and to provide for a form for the reflection of sentiments of business in general regarding matters affecting its interests.

The annual dues shall be \$15.00 per commercial and organizational membership and \$3.00 per individual, Payable yearly, or such other sums as the Board of Directors may deem sufficient to secure the bona fide and permanent character of the corporation. Members shall be admitted into the corporation upon making proper application in writing in accordance with the by-laws and regulations that may be adopted and approved by the membership.

This corporation will not apply for a liquor license nor engage in the sale of alcoholic beverages, and no vinous, distilled or malt liquor shall be sold or purveyed upon any premises owned or leased by the corporation.

Fourth. The corporation shall exist perpetually.
