

The mentally retarded and physically handicapped residents in the institutions and group homes are entitled to a moment of joy just as we so-called normal people are. Most of the Jewish children and adults have no relatives. They are mentally retarded, mentally ill, institutionalized, deserted, lonely, and forgotten. You can see why we plan to have the Passover dinners for the Jewish residents in the institutions and group homes and we give to every resident enough Matzoh and enough Passover products for the eight days of Pesach.

As in previous years you can participate in the Passover Dinners for these handicapped and retarded children and adults. As in previous years, we will have religious services.

The schedule for the Luncheons (Sedorim) will be:
March 13 - Tree of Life
March 18 - Rodef Shalom
March 22 - Beth Shalom.

The community will discover that there are Jewish people in institutions languishing for love and Jewishness. Through the ceremonies the participants will receive a deeper feeling of identification with their faith.
