**DON'T LET THE LIGHT GO OUT.** The despairing cry on the lips of Europe's surviving Jews—for permanent homes in lands of safety, for tools which will help them become self-supporting, for strength to fashion new, enriched lives out of the ashes of the past—has been heeded by American Jewry. Conscious of the world's indifference to the survivors' plight in the face of their steadily deteriorating conditions, the Jews of the United States have determined that the victims shall not succumb to demoralization in 1947 after winning their battle for life in 1946. Through the \$170,000,000 "Campaign of Sacrifice" of the United Jewish Appeal, the American Jewish community has pledged its financial and moral resources for the fulfillment of the far-reaching reconstruction programs carried on by the Joint Distribution Committee, the United Palestine Appeal and United Service for New Americans.

It is with a good deal of satisfaction that our contributors as well as our officers of the Welfare Fund have again agreed to give their utmost and do their best toward this end.


As chairman I again want to express my deep appreciation for the splendid spirit with which they have undertaken this work.



C. is required to expand its relief and child care programs to sustain a total of 140,000 Jewish children in Europe. The future of the Jewish people in Europe depends on the rehabilitation of the younger generation in 1947.

Large scale relief for the survivors in European lands, mass settlement and upbuilding in Palestine and the adjustment of refugees finding a haven in the United States are the three vital programs which must be supported through the United Jewish Appeal in which the Joint Distribution Committee, the United Palestine Appeal and the National Refugee Service are represented.

**THE LONG TREK TO WHERE?** The roads of Europe are filled with hundreds of thousands of displaced Jews looking for a place they might call home. From Poland to Germany to Austria to Italy they wander hoping eventually to reach Palestine. The \$170,000,000 campaign for the United Jewish Appeal for Refugees, Overseas Needs and Palestine will provide the necessary funds for their relief, medical care, transportation and resettlement in Palestine through the U. J. A. constituent agencies, the Joint Distribution Committee and United Palestine Appeal.

In the crucial year of 1947 American Jewry is making an extraordinary effort for the survival and reconstruction of the Jewish people through the nationwide campaign of the United Jewish Appeal in behalf of the Joint Distribution Committee, the United Palestine Appeal and the National Refugee Service.

### **American Fund for Palestinian Institutions**

This organization has as its aim to consolidate and centralize fund-raising for the various deserving educational, cultural and social welfare institutions in Palestine (not supported by any other united fund) and thereby to reduce campaign expenses, to eliminate duplication of appeals and to enable public control of funds raised in America for these purposes as well as equitable distribution to all of the 81 beneficiaries of the American Fund for Palestinian Institutions.

### **American Jewish Congress**

The American Jewish Congress seeks to: defend the equal rights of Jews everywhere; combat anti-Semitism abroad as reflected in attacks upon the political, economic, religious and human rights of Jews; further the development of Palestine; expose anti-Semitic organizations in the United States; combat economic discrimination in this country, and develop intelligent public opinion concerning Jewish interests and problems.

### **American Ort Federation**

ORT—Organization for Rehabilitation Through Training—operates trade schools, workshops, farming projects, employment services, credit and technical advisory bureaus, and supplies tools, machinery and material in Europe, North and South America, Mexico, Cuba, North and South Africa and Shanghai. In addition to aiding the integration of Jews in their local economy, ORT helps to prepare Chalutzim for emigration to Palestine.

### **Jewish Theological Seminary**

The Jewish Theological Seminary of America, founded in 1887 in New York City, trains rabbis for

Conservative pulpits. It has the world's largest Jewish library and a famous museum of Jewish historical and ceremonial objects. The Seminary, with the cooperation of the National Broadcasting Corporation, produces "The Eternal Light" radio program.

### **Anti-Defamation League & American Committee**

Through representatives in hundreds of communities throughout the U. S., the Anti-Defamation League of B'nai B'rith works to discover instances of anti-Semitism and to counteract them. Through the press, books, lectures, radio, the stage, universities, and through cooperation with non-Jewish organizations, it seeks to promote better understanding of Jews, general tolerance, and democratic cooperation.

### **Contingent Fund for Meshulochim**

The committee which passes upon all applications from agencies represented by traveling solicitors or meshulochim. We ask our subscribers to make no donations to meshulochim, but to contact William Horwitz, M. A. Berlan, or Harry Cohn immediately, if they are approached. With your cooperation and assistance we can give the protection and immunity to which your contribution to the fund entitles you.

### **Council of Jewish Federation and Welfare Funds**

This is a non-profit fact finding organization supported by quite a number of the Welfare Funds throughout the country. It gets reports on the various organizations and institutions we contribute to and give us first-hand information so that we can judge for ourselves how much to contribute to them.

### **United Jewish Appeal**

The United Jewish Appeal has undertaken the most solemn responsibility for Jewish survival in the history of our people. \$100,000,000 was raised to meet the minimum requirements of the 1,500,000 Jewish survivors in Europe. More than 75 per cent are not receiving any help from UNRRA. The United Jewish Appeal is the unified fund-raising instrument of the Joint Distribution Committee, United Palestine Appeal and National Refugee Service. For 1947 they are striving to raise \$170,000,000.

### **Federated Council of Palestine Institutions**

This is an organization of very able men in Palestine who receive money from the United States and distribute this to the various worthy institutions of Palestine. All the money we send them is distributed—none goes to collectors. This eliminates the necessity of having various collectors come to this country and solicit for these institutions, a large percentage of the money collected often times going to these collectors. It also eliminates many personal contacts with these collectors.

### **Hebrew Sheltering and Immigrant Aid Society—(HIAS)**

The HIAS has branches in various seaboard ports of the United States and South America to aid immigrants upon arrival, meeting their immediate needs and giving them assistance.

It provides expert advice in securing visas, arranging personal papers, assists with transportation and emigration, and helps to locate relatives. It gives instruction in citizenship, transmits funds to persons in need, maintains sheltering homes for

immigrants in New York, and operates a bureau in Washington to assist with legal problems in connection with immigration and citizenship.

**The Hebrew University  
Mt. Scopus, Palestine**

From all parts of Europe and the Near East have come hundreds of young men and women to study at the world famous Hebrew University on Mt. Scopus—many of them denied an education in the country from which they had to flee. Teaching them is a faculty of internationally recognized scholars and scientists—many of them also refugees. Scientific and medical discoveries of world wide importance are being made at the University. Vast practical benefits already have come to Palestine from the University's work.

**Hillel Foundation of B'nai B'rith**

Over 20,000 Jewish university students are being aided by the religious, educational, social, and cultural activities of the Hillel Foundations. On more than 30 campuses in all parts of the country the Foundations are working to help these young people to adjust themselves to university life, to continue and develop their interest in Judaism, and to prepare them for future community service and leadership. Dr. Abram L. Sachar is national director.

**Hebrew Theological College  
Isaac Elchanan Yeshiva**

**Jewish Theological Seminary of America**

These are institutions located in New York and Chicago for teaching and training men as rabbis and teachers. They make no charge to any of the

students. They are all institutions of recognized standing.

**Jewish Home For Aged**

This is an institution located in Pittsburgh for elderly people who are homeless. Anyone who cannot afford to pay is taken care of free of charge. Butler has had three or four people in the last fifteen years at that home.

**Jewish Welfare Board**

The Jewish Welfare Board was organized in 1917 to minister to Jewish men and women in the armed services. In World War II it is one of the six National Agencies included in the U.S.O. again serving the needs of Jewish men and women in service.

**Jewish Consumptive Relief Society  
Los Angeles Sanitarium  
National Home For Jewish Children  
National Jewish Hospital  
of Denver, Colorado**

These institutions give free care and treatment to indigent persons suffering from tuberculosis. Many of them have come to Denver and Los Angeles from all parts of the country. They have their own farms and have an extensive dairy department and many acres under cultivation. They each have about 200 patients. One of your directors visited these institutions personally. We have had at least two persons from Butler in these institutions.

### **Joint Distribution Committee**

For the past thirty-one years the Joint Distribution Committee has dedicated itself to sustaining life and hope among distressed Jews in nearly fifty countries throughout the world. At present the major part of its relief and rehabilitation activities is centered in continental Europe where approximately 1,500,000 Jews have survived the Nazi terror. Ships, trucks and planes are rushing food, clothing, medical supplies and tools for self-help to nearly every European country. At least one-half of the 150,000 homeless, orphaned children surviving in Europe receive J. D. C. aid. J. D. C. assists destitute survivors to new and better lives by arranging and paying for transportation to Palestine and other lands.

### **Loan Fund**

We have a local loan fund with approximately \$3500 in the treasury which makes loans without interest to local Jewish people, to be paid back in monthly installments.

### **Relief For Yemenite Jews**

There are approximately 42,000 Jews in Yemen, a state which borders on Palestine. This group is a poverty stricken community with little if any means of sustenance and support.

### **The National Labor Committee**

This institution is located in Palestine and takes care of the new arrivals upon entry to that country. They assist them by placing them in work for which they are fitted and help them to get settled.

### **Transients**

This is a local committee of which Sigmund Nast is in charge at the present time. He takes care of any Jewish transients who come through town; provides them with lodging and meals; and arranges for their transportation.

### **National Refugee Service**

The National Refugee Service offers, through the cooperation of 1,000 local committees, a program of assistance to refugees in the United States, including employment and vocational retraining opportunities; temporary economic aid; loans for self-support, business and professional enterprises; instruction in English, Americanism and other fields; and a planned program of resettlement. It provides migration service to individuals in the United States interested in immigration of relatives and friends, and furnishes its corporate affidavit to the Government as the basis for issuance of immigration visas to refugees when necessary.

### **United Palestine Appeal**

The United Palestine Appeal, central fund-raising instrument of American Jewry for the reconstruction and resettlement of the Jewish National Home, has embarked on the largest program in its history to enable Palestine to receive a maximum number of the survivors of European Jewry. The agencies receiving American support through the U. P. A.—the Jewish Agency for Palestine, Palestine Founda-

tion Fund and Jewish National Fund—required \$51,759,405 in 1946 to carry out their programs of large-scale immigration, land acquisition, agricultural and industrial development, housing and reintegration of returning servicemen and women.

The above named organizations receive their share of the funds raised by the United Jewish Appeal.
